

## *A Word from one of our Ministers*

Friends,

I write this on Ash Wednesday as we are beginning our Lenten journey towards the Cross, travelling with Christ as he moves inexorably towards death – but also therefore towards resurrection. I want to share the poem below with you: it is by a Church of Scotland minister in Dumbarton, the Revd Eleanor Hamilton. She shares her original poetry on her Facebook page, **Whispers of Grace**, and allows its sharing with attribution.

So often Lent can be about what we are giving up, how we are going to make ourselves suffer the deprivation of things which bring us comfort, joy or pleasure. Whilst I do think that Lent is an invitation to deeper reflection, and I would encourage you in some kind of Lent devotion, I think we do God and ourselves a disservice if we think that giving up chocolate, cheese or chips is going to do the job.

I might encourage you to read with me as I use Ann Voskamp's devotional book, *Loved to Life*, which takes 40 days to walk through readings from John's gospel; I would invite you to spend some time in prayer, and whether that is a new practice for you or perhaps you are a prayer warrior of many years' devotion, spending more time with God is never a bad idea.

Revd Hamilton asks us to consider Lent in a different way – to turn our attention this Lent outward: can our Lenten practice have an impact on the world in some way? Whilst we might really want to give up sugar or chips for Lent, what difference could that make for the Kingdom? If we spent £4 on chips every week, how can we redirect that resource for the benefit of others?

Lent comes at the time of year when we are still living with some darkness, some gloom, but there is a touch of spring in the air, and the light is coming back, and perhaps our mood is lifting, and we are feeling a little lighter and brighter. I want to invite you to reflect on the poem in your quiet time, or in your house group perhaps, and see what it says to you and to those with whom you discuss it. What difference might that perspective bring to your experience of Lent this year?

Let's remember that we, as Christians, know that the resurrection is coming too. When we are in a season of great change and discernment at Cornerstone, we might sometimes forget that there are cycles of what Brueggemann called orientation, disorientation and reorientation. Life might ever be at some stage in that cycle, but just as the cycle of the liturgical year promises us that Easter comes after Lent, we can be sure that reorientation to a new normal and orientation to a period of steadiness will also

come on the heels of disorientation.

As we live through Lent this year, with its opportunities for challenge, reflection and fasting, let's hold fast to the promises of God, faithful to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and through all generations ever since: God is with us, and through the trials and temptations of this life, we can know the peace and the grace we are offered as co-heirs of the Kingdom with Christ, who gave of his all that we might know how much we are loved by God.



## **Partridge Green Methodist Chapel**

There has been a Methodist presence in Partridge Green since the late 1800's with a certain Mr Scrase starting a Methodist society in the village, with services sometimes being held in the Railway Station waiting room. A wooden Chapel with a tin roof was completed by 1888 on the site of the current Chapel. Worship continued there until 1906 when the church where we worship today was opened. The original wooden building was used as a schoolroom until the early 1930s when the current building comprising a hall, kitchen and toilets was completed.



The position of the church and schoolroom in the centre of the High Street has always been one of its strengths. During the war years the schoolroom was used during the day as an evacuee school for London children who were staying in the village and in the evening it was used as a canteen the soldiers billeted in the village Sunday School

Over the last three decades increasingly strong links have developed between the Methodist Church and the Anglican church in the village, St Michaels. A Village cafe takes place each month organised by members of both Anglican and Methodist congregations. A well-attended Messy church is organised by the Methodist Church running every school holiday but it would not be possible without the strong support of Saint Michael's church.

In the early years there was an active Sunday School and a Youth Group for teenagers and this continued well into the 1990s but recently work with families is represented by Messy Church. There was also an active Women's Fellowship but with a declining membership this sadly had to close. There is a very active club for older people – The Open Door – which meets once a fortnight, providing fellowship and entertainment, as well as tea and cake!

The "Covid era" enabled us to form stronger links with the two Horsham Methodist churches when "in person" Sunday Services were not possible and technology in the form of Zoom took over. We got to know members of the other two churches in this way which was a great strength to Partridge Green where the number of active members had dwindled. When life returned to normal in 2021 this new fellowship flourished and in September 2024 Cornerstone Methodist Church was formed, with close links being developed amongst the three chapels.

Partridge Green Chapel has always been known as a warm and welcoming place where new people soon feel at home. Do come and visit!

## HOUSEGROUPS

As the Wesleys toured round England in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century to awaken somnolent Christians, they converted them to meet as worshippers on Sundays. The Wesleys wanted people to go back to regular Anglican worship and believed that talking to one another helped to maintain a new found faith. However they had a shortage of buildings dedicated for worship by these reawakened . Their leaders preached fervently on Sundays. It seemed important to witness and fire up these Christians on all days of the week but there was a lack of chapels.

The Wesleys wanted the converts to meet and talk. So they grouped together and would meet in each others homes. I like to think that these people needed spiritual support, and a group of them meeting in a house could rightfully call themselves a housegroup. At Cornerstone we have several of these, and the one I have been its leader has been in existence for over fifty years . I am referring to, of course, Newlands Housegroup . Our group has chosen to meet monthly on the third Tuesday of the month at my home.

At best there were ten persons meeting regularly but at present we are eight in number, so it would be superb if we gained some newcomers joining and build up the membership for the future.



It would be very helpful if housegroup leaders could provide the editor with meeting dates for inclusion in the monthly diary


